Today, we take the time to remember those who have gone before us in faith and now live forever in God's heavenly love. As we celebrate the **Solemnity of All Saints**, may we be inspired by the lives of the saints. Saints are recognized for the ways they followed Jesus and lived the Gospel. Even if we may never be officially recognized by the church as saints, by our Baptism we are called to be saints.

The Beatitudes, our guidelines for faithful living, challenge us to live a saintly life which will lead us to eternal life. The everyday saints in our midst are those who live lives of integrity, humility and generosity. We are reminded that those who are *humble, poor in spirit, meek, innocent, pure in heart and merciful* will be recipients of heaven and enjoy the splendor of God's presence.
